


2022 ANNUAL REPORT

Each time I travel to India and visit our shelters, schools and resource centers, I am reminded of the powerful shift that happens in a young woman's life when she has access to a supportive community and quality education. I first met Sonali in 2015 when she was just beginning her healing process and joining our metalsmith program. Over the years she cultivated skillsets that grew her confidence, and the loving circle of women that surrounded Sonali helped her see her intrinsic value. Sonali graduated and was hired to be the jewelry center's production manager! With a salary above the poverty line and a mind full of possibility, she blossomed into the beautiful, talented woman she is today. We were so happy to reunite on this recent trip - I was wearing the earrings she helped design and produce!

There are 15 million women and girls enslaved in India - coerced into child marriage, forced labor or sexual exploitation. Each one worthy of, and waiting for, a chance to overcome her obstacles and live a life of freedom. Because of your steady support we are able to offer both immediate action and sustainable solutions to survivors. 
